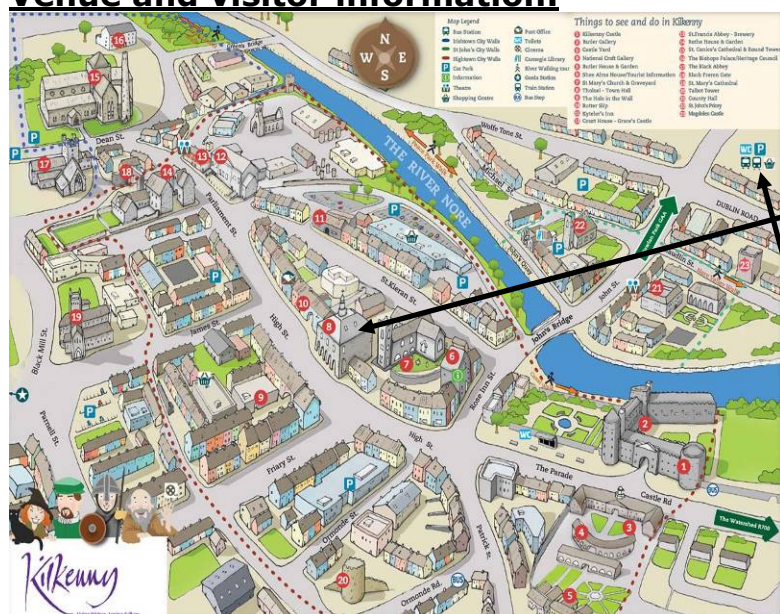

The Tholsel, now the City Hall, is on High Street in the city centre. It was built in 1761 by Alderman William Colles as a place for collecting tolls, but has also been used as a customs house, a courthouse and a guildhall.

The train station is just off the Dublin Road and is on the main Dublin Heuston – Waterford route with connections to Cork, Limerick and Galway. It is junction 8 or 9 of the M9 motorway.
