NFLA talk nuclear with Welsh Minister

The NFLA Welsh Forum Vice Chair Ray Davies and the NFLA Secretary met with Welsh Environment Minister John Griffiths and officials to discuss Welsh energy policy and its stance on new nuclear build at Wylfa.

Accompanying the NFLA pair was Neil Crumpton, an independent energy consultant who has

helped Friends of the Earth Cymru submit a detailed response to the Welsh Assembly's inquiry into Welsh energy policy.

The meeting allowed the NFLA to raise concerns that nuclear new build diverted attention from the benefits to Wales of renewable energy, micro generation and energy efficiency. The need to

tackle fuel poverty and concerns over radioactive waste were also raised.

The Minister welcomed the NFLA submission and outlined the Welsh Government's energy policy. Further dialogue was encouraged. A NFLA seminar in Cardiff in January is now planned on Welsh energy policy.

UK Fukushima nuclear safety review final report produced

The UK Chief Nuclear Inspector's final report on nuclear safety following the March Fukushima disaster was published in mid October.

The final report adds in a number of additional conclusions & several recommendations but does not change its overall view that the UK nuclear safety regime is

broadly fit-for-purpose and the Fukushima incident does not raise any specific issues of concern to it.

In a media release the NFLA put forward the view that it was disappointed with the narrow remit of the report. It also noted the timing of its publication when the Fukushima incident is still not under

full control.

The NFLA Secretary wrote to the Chief Inspector after NFLA submissions were not placed initially on the ONR's website.

The NFLA Secretary raised queries with the Deputy Chief Inspector at a NuLEAF meeting and will attend an ONR November dialogue.

NFLA provide Fukushima presentation to KIMO Conference

The NFLA Secretary was one of the speakers at the October 2011 KIMO Conference in the city of Aberdeen.

The NFLA Secretary provided an overview to councillors and council officers from across Northern Europe of the marine pollution issues relating to Fukushima.

Independent marine samples, attained by Greenpeace, show high levels of radioactive contamination in fish and seaweed some 55 kms from the stricken Fukushima reactors.

Some 7 months after Fukushima a recent independent study has shown that the disaster

released far more radiation than the Japanese Government has claimed. It also noted that spent fuel cooling ponds played a role in the leak of caesium 137, which could have been prevented. A media release on the NFLA website offers further detail on this report.

NFLA energy policy in influential Councillor magazine

The NFLA's energy policy was highlighted in a full two page article in the October edition of the 'C'Ilr' magazine, which is published by the Local Government Information Unit.

In response to an August interview with the Leader of Somerset County Council, advocating new

build at Hinkley, the NFLA article includes interviews with Glasgow councillor Euan McLeod, Cardiff councillor Ed Bridges & Manchester councillor Mark Hackett.

The article gives a fair representation of the work of the NFLA in local government and in its interaction with the

nuclear industry and regulators, the various Governments and the wider NGO community.

It also noted its energy policy promoting the benefits of renewable energy, microgeneration and energy efficiency.

Consultations – Hinkley discharges / Submarine dismantling

The NFLA Secretariat is co-operating with a collection of groups to submit a detailed response to the Environment Agency's consultation on the environmental permits

for the proposed Hinkley nuclear reactor. This has been extended to mid December.

Meanwhile, the NFLA will take a full part in the MOD's consultation

on dismantling nuclear submarines, which was launched on October 28th. Further details on the NFLA response will be profiled in future newsletters.

Mayors for Peace Executive to discuss 2012 strategy

Manchester councillor Mark Hackett and the NFLA Secretary will represent the city, and the wider NFLA movement, at the November board meetings of the Mayors for Peace.

The meetings will discuss the direction of the Mayors for Peace

following its milestone of passing 5000 members last month.

The meeting will discuss its 2012 Action Plan, the operating cost of the group and the setting up of regional sections. NFLA is one of Mayors for Peace's partner organisations around the world.

Meanwhile, the NFLA are shortly submitting a response to the cross-party and influential 'Trident Commission'. The Commission is considering the need for, and alternatives to, the UK Trident nuclear weapons system. The November newsletter will provide more information on this.

NFLA Wales Forum – The Welsh Forum held its winter seminar in Caernarfon. Speakers included Carl Clowes from PAWB, the NFLA Secretary and Neil Crumpton for Friends of the Earth. The NFLA Welsh Forum Chair also spoke at a follow-up conference on the alternatives to Wylfa B.

NFLA Ireland Forum – The All Ireland Forum in Ireland holds its winter seminar in Wexford. Former Irish energy minister Eamon Ryan and a speaker from the SEAI will talk about the Irish potential for offshore wind. The NFLA Secretary and Tim Deere-Jones will talk about new nuclear build

and its impact on Ireland.
