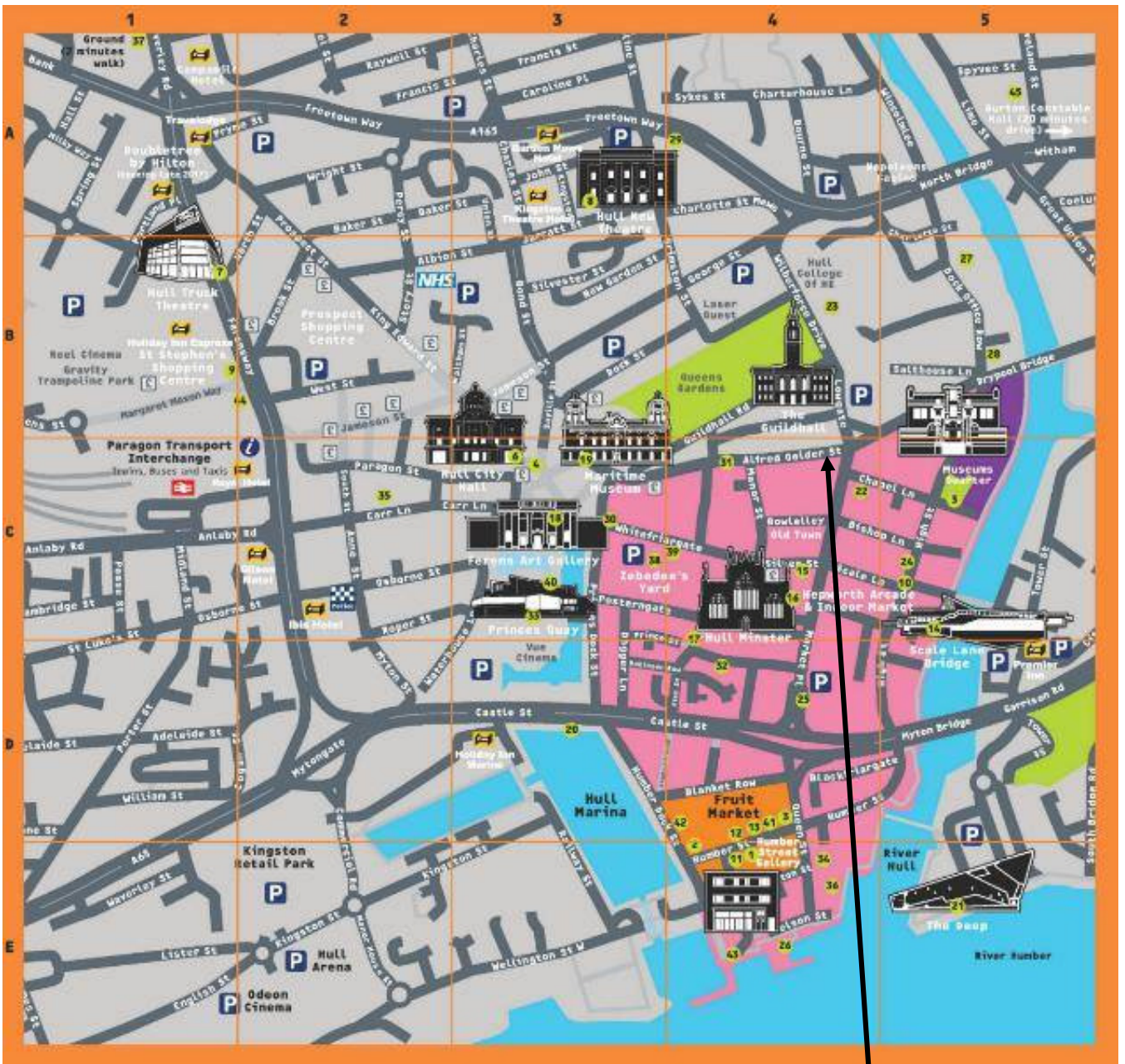
The Guildhall is a 10 minute walk from Hull Paragon Train Station. There are pay and display car parking spaces close to the building.
