Venue and local hotel details:

Motherwell Civic Centre is on the south side of Motherwell town centre, and it also contains Motherwell Concert Hall and Theatre. If you type into 'Google maps' the postcode ML1 1AB a map can be printed off.

Motherwell Rail Station is about a 15 minute walk away from the Civic Centre complex and has trains in daytime every 15 minutes from Glasgow Central, taking around 25 - 35 minutes, and also regularly from Edinburgh, taking around 45 – 60 minutes. The 240 and 244 buses close to the train station go to the Civic Centre. There is also a taxi rank by the station and a free car park (with 60 spaces) in front of the civic complex, which is off the A721.

There are the Dakota Eurocentral Hotel, the Best Western Motherwell Centre Moorings Hotel and the Alona Hotel in Dunfermline, along with a number of other smaller hotels and guesthouses which can be found on hotel search internet sites. A much wider choice is also available in Glasgow.
